

Summary notes of Committee Meeting 3/3/2021

1. Minutes of December Meeting Matters arising
 - 1.1. Improvements Drax Avenue/Copse Hill corner
The Committee noted the improvements, -
 - 1.2. Berkeley Homes
The Chairman reported she was still pressing Berkeley Homes to replace the magnolia where an oak should be according to the planning application
 - 1.3. Not joining Wimbledon Planning Group
The Committee agreed not to join the Group at this time.
2. Treasurer
 - 2.1. Garth Watkins reported that:-The 2020 accounts were approved and will be sent to be audited.
 - 2.2. Subscriptions were fewer in 2020 than in 2019(but see 3.1 below)
3. Membership
Jennifer Mills reported that:-
 - 3.1. A good number of subscriptions had been received so far this year
 - 3.2. She remained anxious to encourage on line payments.
 - 3.3. On privacy management, the Association was entitled to hold names, addresses, email addresses and subscription accounts for members. If residents did not wish this information to be held, then NWWRA must delete the information, but effectively that meant the resident withdrawing from Membership.
4. Planning management
 - 4.1. Tree planting; the Committee commended the Chairman on her success in this. The Chairman said if Committee members and residents would indicate where they thought trees were missing, she would take it up with LBMC for the next round of tree planting.
 - 4.2. The Committee expressed a wish to encourage residents to let them know if they have made a representation, so that where appropriate, NWWRA could support their initiative.
 - 4.3. Sustainability; the Committee noted that sustainability had become primary requirement for the granting of planning permission applications.
5. Traffic
 - 5.1. Speed control Woodhayes/Copse Hill; the Committee agreed that illuminated road speed signs would be very welcome in this area.
 - 5.2. Copse Hill road layout; Now That Berkeley Homes are nearly finished work, the Committee proposed to raise the matter of Copse Hill road layout again.
6. Climate control; James Neish reported on LBMC's climate control action group.
7. Police; Pam Saeed reported that it was difficult to get a response from the traffic police.
8. Wimbledon Museum refurbishment; the Committee agreed to confer with other Associations about Associations supporting this, and would draw the members' attention to this good cause.
